Cor Unum in Patre, Living Covenant Culture

As the Schoenstatt Movement of Texas, we read the current lifestream of the Church today and Schoenstatt in our State. For inspiration, we considered our previous motto, the year of Father Kentenich, and our need to bring the Covenant of Love to our Society. We all saw the need to build authentic family through organic unity, the unique gift that Schoenstatt has for the Church. We have discerned that our identity for this year's lifestream is Cor Unum in Patre – One heart in the Father. This entails the two-in-oneness and interwoveness of fates of our family. United in our Father and Founder and in God the Father. We also realized that this identity expresses the Covenant of Love in a profound way. Our Mother shares one heart with the Father as we share our hearts with hers. It contains an ideal for us to aspire to: to get to know both Father Kentenich's mission and charism.
